

Commentary

- Goal Achieved: 80%. Goal setting looks different at each grade and within classrooms. However, achievement of this goal indicates that students are experiencing success with having this goal as our focus this year.
- Since this goal is achieved, staff discussed and voted on a new goal for the upcoming school year: Instructional Efficacy. They picked this goal because they felt it was an area they could focus on to make the greatest impact on student learning.
